

Gift Acceptance Policy

- Hedgebrook solicits and accepts gifts that are consistent with its mission and that support its core programs, as well as special projects. Hedgebrook urges all prospective donors to seek the assistance of their personal legal and financial advisors before making any gift to identify any resulting tax and estate planning consequences. Hedgebrook generally accepts donations and other forms of support from individuals, partnerships, corporations, organizations, government agencies or other entities. However, certain restrictions may apply, including: Gifts of real or personal property and restricted or otherwise unmarketable securities may only be accepted upon approval of the Executive Director and the Executive Committee of Hedgebrook's Board and, if necessary or advisable, counsel.
- Donations of personal property must be in new or nearly new or, in the case of antiques, in marketable condition;
- Donors of personal property must deliver their donations to a mutually agreeable location;
- Hedgebrook shall not accept gifts that, in the sole discretion of the Executive Director and the Executive Committee and its legal advisors: (a) may result in Hedgebrook violating its corporate charter or losing its status as a § 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization; (b) present undue difficulty or challenges in their administration; (c) result in any unacceptable consequences for Hedgebrook; or (d) violate or otherwise contradict Hedgebrook's mission.
